Each year, new and returning HAAS students are required to read selected novels and complete specific grade level assignments. Studies show that most students experience a loss of reading skills over the summer months, but children who continue to read actually gain skills. Over the summer, parents can assist their children in sustaining and bolstering their reading skills, strengthening their vocabulary, and reinforcing the benefits of reading for enjoyment.

For the 2011-2012 school year at Hollywood Academy of Arts & Science, each student is required to read two books and complete the summer reading book report for each.

Failure to complete these assignments will result in the student receiving zeros.

It is **mandatory** that all students read the required reading book for his/her grade level. In addition, your child is required to read a second book of his/her choice. While we have provided you with a suggested reading list, please note that you are not limited to this selection and that your child may choose another book at grade level.

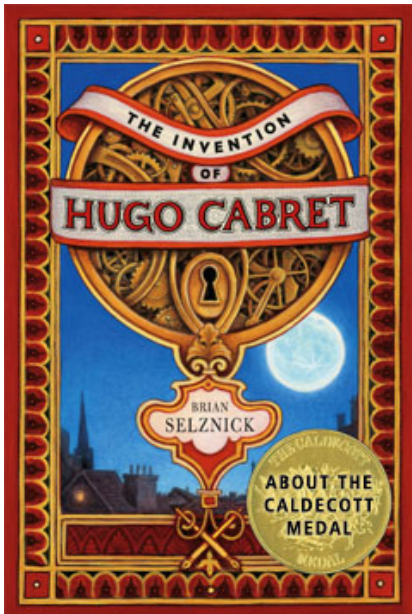
Your child has the opportunity to complete a third book report for extra credit. This may also be a book of their choice at grade level.
